

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Thank you for helping your son or daughter pursue his/her desire to participate in Cru High School Global Missions! My team and I support you as a parent, and your role as guide and guardian of your child. I want to keep open communication with you about our Global Missions and what they involve.

Some very important information is included in this packet. Please take time to read and consider it and let us know if you have any questions. After you read the confidential questions on the next page and the explanation of Cru High School Global Missions' financial policy, please **sign the consent form and send it to Cru High School Global Missions at 100 Lake Hart Drive, Dept 3200, Orlando, FL 32832.** *We must receive the Parent/Guardian Consent form before your child's application can be evaluated.*

The questions on the next page are the same questions your child is asked on the application regarding her/his moral convictions and health/medical information. Your child's answers to the questions are private and will be held in strict confidence. The child's application will only be viewed by the person evaluating it and the project leaders overseeing his/her personal development on the project. These confidential questions help team leaders develop a plan to encourage his/her personal growth.

All project participants (students, staff members and other adults) are carefully selected. Once accepted, project participants receive special written and verbal leadership training to prepare for the global experience. Part of this training comes through an acceptance packet and project manuals.

Students who participate in Cru High School Global Missions gain several positive benefits:

- International travel in a supervised, Christian context
- Greater confidence in communication skills
- Greater appreciation for America as well as other countries and cultures
- Development of leadership abilities and gifts
- Life-changing ministry opportunities
- Personal spiritual growth and faith-stretching experiences
- Focused service to help expand an ongoing youth movement in the host country
- Experience with the dynamics of working on a team

Cru High School is the high school and middle school ministry of Cru, an interdenominational Christian organization with over 26,000 staff and 550,000 trained volunteers serving in 191 countries. We emphasize communicating our faith in Christ with others and building Christians in their faith. Cru's purpose is to help fulfill our Lord's Great Commission as recorded in Matthew 28:18-20. We have been offering international projects for over 30 years. We are excited about your child's interest in joining us!

Questions your student will see on the application:

Moral Conviction Information

We know the following are sensitive questions. This information will be treated confidentially and will only be seen by individuals directly involved in your application decision and by appropriate project leadership. Your honest answers will not necessarily disqualify you for acceptance. Our main concern in asking the following questions is to make sure a project will be a good fit for you—meaning, if you struggle with any of the following, the environment on a particular project may or may not be a good place for you. We are concerned about your growth. We may need to discuss the questions further. If you prefer to discuss your answers in more detail over the phone, please respond to each question in writing and at the end of your written response also indicate that you'd like for us to call you.

Moral Conviction Information:

1. In the last 12 months have you...
 - been intoxicated with alcohol?
 - used narcotics, hallucinogens, drugs or tobacco products not prescribed by a physician?
 - struggled with an eating disorder?
 - had any incidents of intentional self-injury or cutting yourself?
 - struggled with or participated in same-sex relationships/practice?
 - had any incidents which would not fall in line with 1 Thessalonians 4:3-4 by controlling your body in holiness and honor? (You may have different terms for these, but some examples would be: viewing pornography, oral sex, sexual intercourse, and/or any other sexual foreplay)
 - If you answer yes to any of these you will be asked to please explain the relevant details. Examples of helpful details: explain the activities and situations you have been involved in and how frequently. Would you consider this an area with which you struggle? Include steps you have taken to change that involvement. Who have you included in your journey regarding this area? Are you willing to refrain from this during the mission project? If you prefer a phone call to discuss this answer, respond to this question by writing "please call."
2. Briefly explain your understanding of what the Bible teaches about sexual purity (principles). What have you done to pursue this standard (both in convictions and practices)? Please be specific.

Health/Medical Information

Why are we asking health/medical questions? It is important for you to understand that the challenges of your own pre-existing conditions (physical, psychological, emotional) along with the specific environment on a project may present difficulties for you.

The following are some conditions you may encounter on a project:

- Extended air-travel
- Housing without elevators, or air conditioning
- Extensive walking, or taking public transportation possibly while carrying luggage
- Full and/or very demanding schedule
- Food that is prepared for the whole project (you may not have control over what food is available)
- Being or working in a beach environment where people wear bathing suits all the time
- Spending your summer with others who are new to you
- Sharing cramped living quarters
- Not having your own space most of the time, and limited free time

Please note: A pre-existing medical condition does not necessarily disqualify you from being accepted to participate in a project, however it is a necessary component of the application process to ask these questions. Know that we may not be able to arrange for all your needs.

1. In light of the situations listed above, do you have any significant health issues, physical limitations or disabilities that may affect your ability to participate fully in the mission project or would require special arrangements in order to take part?
2. If you take any medications, will you be able to have enough for the duration of the project?
3. Do you have any allergies? To what?
4. Do you receive any on-going medical treatments? If so please comment.
5. Do you have any psychological/emotional conditions or struggles? (Examples: depression, phobia, suicidal thoughts, significant anxiety, bipolar disorder.) If yes please explain the history, frequency, and treatments/steps you've taken to get healthy.

Financial Policy Information

One of the most thrilling parts of a Global Missions project is seeing other people partner with our team members by pledging their prayer and financial support. Time and time again, students are in awe of how God provides for His work. Many express that the process of enlisting others to join them in this ministry is one of the most faith-building elements of their experience.

While this is an exciting journey of faith for each student, it is also an important responsibility to assume. Most students see God provide in amazing ways. Many exceed their financial goal and designate the extra funds the Lord provides to those who still need funds. However, there are times when a student does not reach his/her financial goal before the Project Briefing.

The following guidelines apply to participants on Cru High School Global Missions:

- When a receipt is issued for donations to Cru, a non-profit organization, these funds become the property of Cru – not the individual who solicited the donation.
- Project costs do not include domestic airfare to the project's departure city. However, team members can claim reimbursement for domestic airfare if they have raised enough money to cover that cost.
- If a team member raises more money than the cost of the mission, the excess amount stays within the project. However, the individual with the overage may designate it to another team member.
- If a team member has a shortfall in funds raised to pay for the mission, these options apply:
 - If the participant is within \$500 of his/her project cost on the project start date, arrangements need to be made to cover that shortfall before departure with these options in mind:
 - Team members who raise excess funds, can designate them to those with a shortfall
 - A Cru staff member or a Cru city ministry can transfer the needed balance to the person
 - The participant or his/her parent/guardian can give personal funds to cover the balance
 - The parent/guardian can agree to send the funds to Cru High School Global Missions while the participant is on the mission
 - The participant and/or the parent/guardian can make a payment arrangement to send in the funds within three months after the mission ends
 - If a participant has a significant shortfall in raised funds two weeks before departure day, he/she or the parent/guardian should call the Global Missions office or mission director to discuss next steps.
 - If a participant and/or a parent/guardian are uncomfortable making payment arrangements or committing to raise the necessary funds upon return, participants can withdraw from the mission.
- If a mission team member withdraws from a project, these guidelines apply:
 - The minimum withdrawal fee is \$200.
 - There may also be pre-paid, non-refundable expenses which will need to be paid. These may include cancellation fees for airfare, visa costs, lodging deposits - usually less than \$200 additional cost.
 - The person who withdraws needs to inform each donor of his/her decision including:
 - Any funds already raised are used first to cover the costs incurred up to that point
 - The remaining balance, if any, will be used to help others participate
 - If the amount of the expenses exceeds the funds available, payment arrangements need to be made with the Cru High School Global Missions office to cover the difference.
